





In 2006, research showed that 1.1 million New Zealanders (43 percent of the adults aged 16–65) had literacy and numeracy skills below those needed to participate fully in 21<sup>st</sup> century life.



As a result of this information, the Government has invested additional money to strengthen the literacy and numeracy skills of the NZ workforce and those people close to entering the workforce.

This focus on literacy and numeracy complements Otago Polytechnic's own expectations for graduates – that they are competent communicators, numerate and literate.





Throughout your programme lecturers will include learning activities to develop literacy and numeracy skills, particularly those relevant to the vocation you are training for.





The Adult Literacy and Numeracy Assessment Tool is a new tool, being used nationally, to provide information about students' reading, writing, listening and numeracy skills.

Lecturers can use this information to plan their teaching.



When you start your programme, we will ask you to complete a literacy and/or numeracy assessment.

Towards the end of the programme we will ask you to repeat these assessments to see what gains you have made.


The Assessment Tool helps us to know you "the learner," and information from the Tool can then be used to identify the next learning steps.



After viewing your assessment results, if lecturers think you would benefit from additional one-to-one or small group tutorials, they will discuss this with you.







The Assessment Tool allows you and your lecturers to track your progress over time. It also informs our teaching, so we can focus on the areas needed to develop your literacy and numeracy skills.



These assessments are compulsory as we must use the data to report back to Government on the progress we have made with literacy and numeracy within our programmes.

You take most of the assessments online and each learner's assessment is unique.

After approximately 30 questions the computer is able to provide a reliable estimate of your ability.



Shortly, you will be issued with codes that link you to the individual assessments that have been set for you.
