TEACHING TIPS

Planning a Teaching Session

These questions may be useful for you to consider when you are planning a teaching session.

- 1. Who is my audience? How many people will there be? What is their background? What do they already know about my topic?
- 2. How much time do I have for the session? Where will it be held? What equipment is in the room?
- 3. What is the main message I want to get across? What ideas/skills do I want people to take away with them from my session? (What are the "outcomes" for my session?)
- 4. If I had to choose five main points, what would they be? What would be the best ways for people to learn/remember them? What would be the best sequence for presenting them?
- 5. What other learning resources are available on this topic? Are there journal articles, books, or resource people I can direct people to?
- 6. How can I capture people's interest? How can I relate my topic to their experience? Why is my topic relevant to them?
- 7. How are these people used to learning? Is their usual method the most useful for this topic? In what other ways can I encourage them to learn?
- 8. What resources do I need? Is there any extra equipment I need in the room? Are there journals etc that I could take to show them?

Remember: Your session is only **one** of the ways people will "meet" your topic. You do not need to take on the entire responsibility for their success in learning it! Learning is up to the learner.

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
